- 13:36:43 cost reimbursement grants. Please be aware of that if you were already moving forward with your fixed award application, you will want to change that to cost reimbursement application.

- 13:37:01 They are on the funding page; they will guide you through the submission of a competitive and a compliant budget.
- 13:37:16 I will deftly encourage you after this conversation, go into the application instructions and look into the section on the budget instructions and go through that very carefully, I also,
- 13:37:28 if you have not looked at the recording of the webinar, we did two weeks ago on budget development or if you weren't on that call, I would definitely encourage you to go back to that.
- 13:37:38 There are definitely important resources that will help you through the submission of a competitive and compliant budget.
- 13:37:49 That is our goal of having these conversations with you. We want you all to have the resources you need to be competitive and this process.

- 13:39:15 The notice for this office hour session encourages you as I said a few moments ago to either attend that March 10 a best practice and budget development webinar or to look at the budget develop men webinar recording.
- 13:39:26 If you did either of those, this legend looks a little familiar to you. During the webinar we talked about your approved budget, and I should be realistic.
- 13:39:39 It should reflect expected program revenues and expenses and its capacity to carry out program activities. It should also be consistent and aligned with the program's goals and objectives
- 13:39:52 and it should be flexible. We know that a project financial and operating circumstances often change, and the budget needs to be able to adapt to those changing circumstances.
- 13:40:08 We also shared that your team is strong budget design will provide a framework for effective budget management and it will ensure a realistic scope, appropriate detail, a competitive proposal, compliance
- 13:40:17, and effective delivery, that is that strong budget that serves as a roadmap for your program implementation.
- 13:40:27 In order to create a budget that is strong, accurate, and requires minimal clarification, I really encourage you to take your time
- 13:40:30 and engage others in both data collection and quality review.
- 13:40:42 Also during the March 10 webinar our team shared some tips and tools for creating a competitive budget narrative and that bears repeating here today 13:40:46 before we get to the questions.

- 13:41:00 The first tip is as I started out talking about, read and follow the instructions and the notice of funding opportunity and in the application instructions, that is where you're going to find
- 13:41:10 information about the minimum and maximum cost levels and any required line items
- 13:41:12 The strongest and most competitive budget narratives adhere to the guidelines in these documents.
- 13:41:24 I also encourage you to become familiar with the uniform guidance and only include those costs that are allowable, reasonable, necessary, and allocable.
- 13:41:35 You will find the uniform guidance online at ECF are. Federal register.gov under title II grants and agreements.
- 13:41:41 The URL for that is also in the chat.
- 13:41:54 After you and your team estimate the financial resources that you need to reach your goals
- 13:42:00, again, following the guidance in the notice and application instructions. As you develop the narrative, remember to provide adequate descriptions and clear calculations.
- 13:42:13 Now that I have shared those reminders for creating a compliant and competitive budget, we can open the line for your questions. If you have a question 13:42:18, please enter into the Q&A panel.

- 13:42:57 that you don't understand, or you don't know how to enter this in your budget this is your opportunity to ask questions about that or maybe you have already started putting your budget together and

- 13:43:06 This is the opportunity to enter those questions in here now.
- 13:43:22 And get a real-time answer. Additionally, if you prefer to ask a question by voice, you can raise your hand, there is a raise hand feature there on your toolbar that you can raise your hand.

- 13:44:09 >>: We did have one just come in, is it possible to get direct support outside of the webinar for our unique collaborative approach?
- 13:44:19 >>: I am not hundred percent sure what you mean about that question.
- 13:44:28 I will tell you that the information we are going to share with you would be information that we would share with all applicants.
- 13:44:38 We want to make sure that no one has an unfair competitive advantage. Yes, we are available to answer questions and that is why we gave you that resource 13:44:47 for your regional contacts. You can certainly reach out to the regional point of
- contact in your area.

- 13:45:02 We certainly wouldn't provide anything that would give you an edge over someone else. I would just say yes and, that's the answer to that question.
- 13:45:08 There you have the list of the individuals that can help you with your specific questions.
- 13:45:15 Again, their email addresses are on the funding page and the link to that is at the bottom of the screen.
- 13:45:20 Hopefully, that gives you the information you need for that.
- 13:45:31 What other questions do you all have?
- 13:45:37 how can we help you create your most competitive and compliant budget narrative?
- 13:46:59 Welcome back, we saw that you dropped off them.
- 13:47:21 >>: I am showing no open questions since I've came back in. I apologize, I thought everyone else froze
- 13:47:23 not me. Back up and running.
- 13:47:27 >>: The magic of technology.
- 13:47:49 >>: I do see a question now here; must grantees meet the exact match each year or is the match imitative for the three-year award?
- 13:48:02 >>: The fact requirements are in the notice and in the application instructions and it talks about the regulatory match.
- 13:48:25 That amount is accumulative. Jeff, can you go to slide 18. This shows you what the regulatory match is.
- 13:48:43 It shows the dollar by dollar and percent is. Grantees are required then to match dollar by dollar level. That is the match amount itself is cumulative
- 13:49:00 assuming you have a three-year grant, by the end of the three years, he would need to meet that match amount we ask you to budget for each year so that in year one view what budget 24% in year 24 24 year 324
- 13:49:04 but maybe in year one year only matching it at 20%.
- 13:49:25 In you to you get great support and you're able to match it at 30%. Eventually it evens out but by the end of the grant., The period of performance you would need to meet the minimum.
- 13:49:36 I did get there from here one in year three, it is entirely up to you and to your sources of match.
- 13:49:40 Thank you for that question.
- 13:49:53 Again, remember if you would prefer to ask a question verbally, you can use the raise hand
- 13:49:59 feature and we will on mute you, otherwise you can put your questions in the Q&A module.
- 13:50:19 >>: We have a question about food, I've heard that applicants may include food as an allowable budget expense if they justify it. What does AmeriCorps consider inappropriate justification?
- 13:50:32 >>: Great question it. It's one that we like to pay close attention to because food costs are often flogged during audits and monitoring exercises.
- 13:50:52 We like to make sure people are charging food cost appropriately. I mentioned earlier, it talks facility about food
- 13:51:03 related to the information such as a training event or it talks about it in the context of, let's say you are doing a day long training, 924 we will say.

- 13:51:12 Maybe you are in a rural area where there aren't a lot of options for your learners to go and break for lunch.
- 13:51:28 If breaking for those participants to go off site is logistically not feasible and would be extremely time-consuming, then the cost of food to hold that during that training events would be allowable.
- 13:51:41 What I always tell folks, I deftly say if you are budgeting and you are including food, let's say this for a training.
- 13:51:53 To put in there that this is during a programmed lunch or its not feasible to sense our participants off-site.
- 13:52:02 Use some kind of clarification language in your budget narrative so that we are aware of situations like this, and we understand and can justify
- 13:52:17 the inclusion of food in your budget. We don't want you just budgeting food under the idea that this would be entertainment. That is something else where he will find food reference in the uniform guidance.
- 13:52:34 I can be allowable but just make sure that you are justifying it. It is a program timed orders just not visible to go off-site if you are having a two-hour training, I think would be really hard to justify food.
- 13:52:52 But if it's a day long training or a five- or six-hour training that lapses over the lunch period, then it could be justifiable, but you want to be careful.
- 13:53:09 What other questions do you guys have?
- 13:53:20 >>: We do have this question; in an earlier session it was stated that applicants are required to secure all of the matching resources
- 13:53:31 prior to submission and can designate unsecured match as proposed, what should applicants do if they have not yet identified all potential sources
- 13:53:52 of unsecured match and they haven't determined where they will submit a proposal? \
- 13:54:07 >>: And E grants you see here that you have the text that circled here where it says enter source of matching funds
- 13:54:16 it pulls up a second window here where you would actually enter the amount of managed, what the source is, and did ask you
- 13:54:30 to classify that as cash or in-kind or federal, state, or local government, private, but what we also ask and
- 13:54:34 this is again and the application instructions when you all get to reading those budget instructions.
- 13:54:39 It will ask you to indicate if it is secured or proposed.
- 13:54:54 You will see in here in this example that let's say the organization is using their general funds and they know they have those funds, so they identify the as secured
- 13:55:12 they also know they have certain service providers are going to donate their services. That is already secured than they would note that it is secured.
- 13:55:21 They have these other two grants that are out there that are proposed. Maybe there is something else that they want to propose
- 13:55:26 but they just haven't thought about what those resources are.
- 13:55:43 Knowing that you have the full three years to secure your match you could say something like additional private and public funders, hundred thousand dollars proposed or something like that.
- 13:55:54 You would just want to use enough description that anyone looking at this budget narrative could get an idea of what you are trying to do.

- 13:56:06 The other thing that you will see is indicated at the bottom of the section and highlighted with a circle
- 13:56:28 is that you are to apply for cash match replacement. If you think that you cannot secure these additional matching resources, then
- 13:56:49 in the application itself, you will enter the amount of cash match replacement that you are seeking. In this case it's
- 13:57:04 the certain amount, you would indicate that in the narrative itself and then in your budget and management you would put that same amount in that it is cash and a federal source this is funding the AmeriCorps will grant you
- 13:57:21 to apply to the grantee of your budget. It is not going to come out, if you look at the other budget sections, it won't show up and the C and CS share of your budget, but it will come into the grantee share.
- 13:57:38 We will grant you if approved, we would grant you post funds to cover your portion of the budget.
- 13:57:57 I think the bottom line related to all of this; we want to make sure that you all are presenting a reasonable plan for how
- 13:58:08 you're securing your match. Whether it is something you arty have secured or something you are proposing or whether it is cash match replacement that you are seeking from us.
- 13:58:18 We just want to make sure that you have a plan for
- 13:58:21 here is my matching resources and then we look at the actual application narrative here are the activities that are related to these resources as well.
- 13:58:32 That is truly what is going to make this the most competitive application is making sure that this budget clearly supports all of the activities here we have identified 13:58:39 in your narratives. And all of those activities are reflected back in your budget narrative.
- 13:58:48 What other questions do you all have?
- 13:59:03 >>: We do have one question here, what should an organization do if their federally negotiated indirect cost rate expired
- 13:59:07 and they haven't yet received approval for a new rate?
- 13:59:23 >>: Great question, let's talk a little bit about the administration cost and general.
- 13:59:29 The slide talks if little bit about section 3 at the budget narrative.
- 13:59:43 That is the section where you would budget any administrative
- 13:59:52 indirect costs there are three ways you can do this there is Corporation fixed percentage sometimes reference as the 510% fixed administrative cost option
- 14:00:00 then there is a federally approved indirect cost rate and a 10% diminished rate.
- 14:00:12 I'm going to talk about the two easy ones first and that is the corporate fix percentage without any documentation you are eligible to claim 5% of all direct
- 14:00:26 cost and the CNC as share or AmeriCorps share of your budget. You can claim 5% of that as
- 14:00:35 administration costs you need no documentation for that you can just alrighty claim that 5%. Similarly, you can claim up to 10% of the total direct costs
- 14:01:00 that would be both, our egrants-- you can claim up to 10% of that and your grantee share as indirect cost. That is the Corporation fixed percentage.
- 14:01:12 He also had the 10% diminished rate where you can also claim 10% of modified total direct cost.

- 14:01:22 That would be it does include your equipment doesn't include over a certain percentage of sub grants.
- 14:01:33 There is very specific guidance for how you identify and modify total direct cost you can claim up to 10% of that again no documentation required.
- 14:01:48 The third option, here and B, federally approved indirect cost rate
- 14:01:53 that is approved by the federal agency which gives you the most funding, you would apply to them as important indirect cost rate and once you have that
- 14:01:56 and you can use that rate for any federal grant that you have.
- 14:02:07 He would have to have the approved rate from the federal government.
- 14:02:22 We require you to give us the details of that grant and want to do that that constitute the documentation that you need in order to claim not. What is important 14:02:26 is what you're including in your budget must match what you have entered
- 14:02:26 is what you're including in your budget must match what you have entered as far as the rate details and E grants.
- 14:02:37 Let's say, you have a rate that is due to expire March 31, 2022.
- 14:02:48 Which if you enter that information today on March 24, 2022that Rate is still valid.
- 14:02:58 You are waiting for the new rate to come through, you are putting your budget together based on not maybe even submit the budget early.
- 14:03:06 By the time we are getting a round to viewing after the application deadline that rate is expired.
- 14:03:17 What I would suggest is if you are in a situation similar to that that he would make a notation in the budget narrative
- 14:03:31 that you have a new rate that is pending, maybe you know your federal funding told you that we are not going to have the new rate out by March 31 when this expires.
- 14:03:44 We should have it approved by May 31. If you put the and the budget narrative as we are reviewing it, we are aware of it and we can keep an eye on it.
- 14:04:00 If that rate is not approved at the time of the award, we would request that you advise your budget to use option a here the Corporation fixed percentage or
- 14:04:16 in a rare circumstance we might actually approve the award and give you a special condition that says by 60 days after the award date you must submit your new
- 14:04:29 indirect cost rate information and eager grants and then if you're unable to because it is not approved then we would have you go back and revise your budget.
- 14:04:38 If it's significantly different, then once that rate is approved
- 14:04:45 then you could go ahead and amend your budget to reflect the new rate.
- 14:04:56 The bottom line is this is true for pretty much every budget category. The more information you can give us the better you will be.
- 14:05:07 I said earlier, one of the goals is that we want to have a budget that provides or that requires
- 14:05:13 as minimal clarification as possible. The more information that you are giving us in your budget narrative
- 14:05:17 the less we are going to come back to you and ask you to clarify something.
- 14:05:47 I note that egrants system has clarification limits. I'm a huge fan of using those.
- Let's say you are trying to give us some detail about, let's go back to the food question.
- 14:06:04 You have trainings, and you are trying to explain how you are justifying the inclusion of food in there and you ran out of space in a grant, you could add a line and there put zero dollar for the scene as share

14:06:13 zero dollars for total sure and just use that space in the clarification box to give us more information.

14:06:28 Anytime you have, that you come to a roadblock and need to give us more information but there is an e-Grants always think about the opportunity to have a zero dollars line item.

14:06:55 >>: We did have a question, and on the Q&A, can you provide more information around how to contact the federal government to request or obtain a Federal approved rate

14:07:16 >>: it may come from AmeriCorps or any other agency, you would contact them and the process for the theories by agency.

If you have another agency that is, then you would just contact them and 14:07:41 they will work with you and help you understand what you need to submit and how to submit a and how to update it each year or three years

14:07:43 or however long it is approved.

14:07:57 Thank you for that question.

14:08:05 I know people are often puzzled; this seems like a great idea but how do I even go about getting one.
