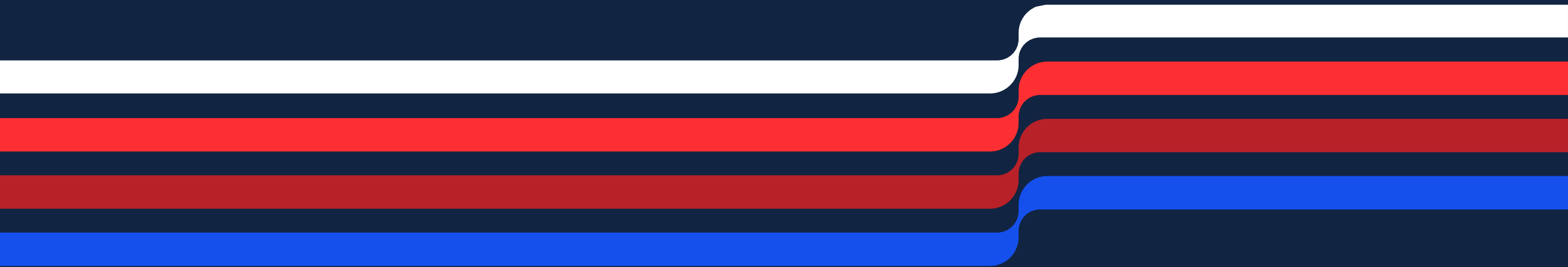

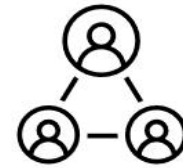
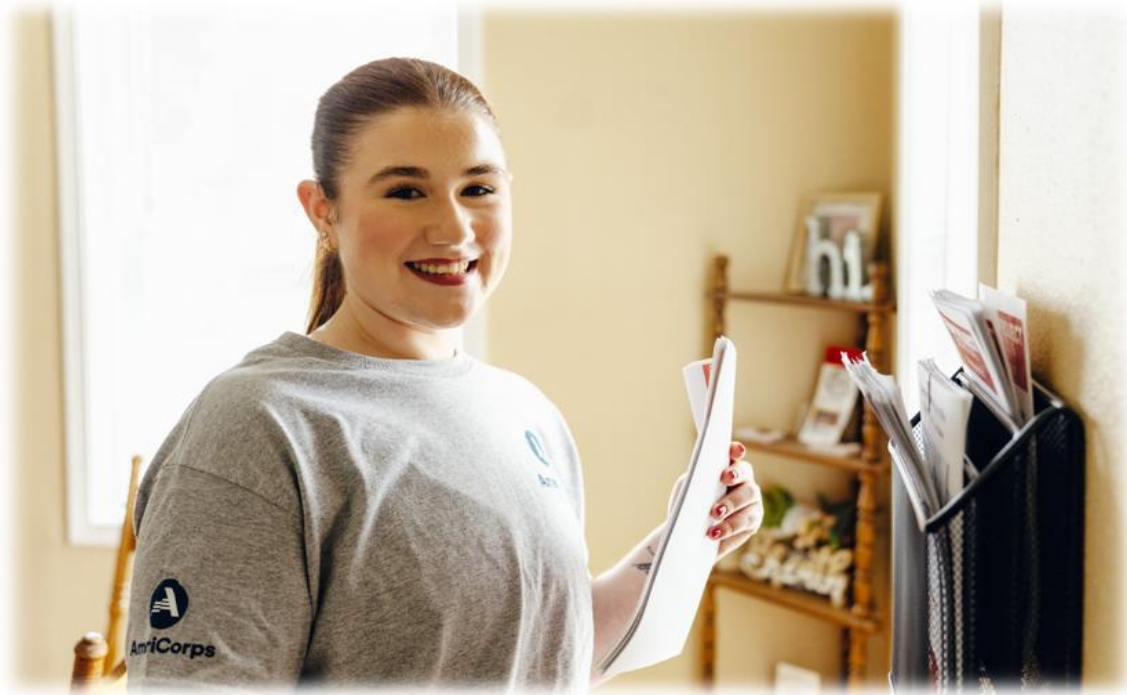

This project utilizes 6 members to increase the capacity of rural and small-town communities in eastern Tennessee and in the Louisville, Kentucky, area to fight the opioid crisis.

- 4 members in TN and 2 members in KY develop community partnerships, design marketing and communications materials, build volunteer systems, conduct outreach, and improve data tracking and analysis systems.
- In FY24, members generated \$16,500 in cash resources and \$17,500 in in-kind resources and engaged 20 volunteers in 1,200 hours of service.

Idaho Department of Correction



This project utilizes approximately 12 members to increase the capacity of the Idaho Department of Corrections mentoring program that serve incarcerated individuals who are experiencing high recidivism rates. The program has an emphasis on economic opportunity. In the past year, members have:

- Increased the number of volunteer mentors statewide from 380 to over 1000.
- Connected over 500 mentor and mentee relationships.
- Recruited and managed 1000 volunteers.
- Developed partnerships, tracking systems, educational opportunities and more.

Direct Service

Providing services to the identified project recipients or clients of a project

Sponsor Responsibilities: Member Management

- Recruit and place members
- Provide workspace, equipment and supplies
- Professional development and on-site orientation & training
- Assist members with community entry
- Member supervision and performance appraisals
- Sponsor Verification Form



AmeriCorps Members serving in the VISTA Program



The Basics



- 18+ years of age
- U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents
- Must pass a national service criminal history check
- May have specific knowledge skills, or abilities required by the sponsoring organization
- Local or national recruits

Leaders



- Projects with six or more members may have a Leader assigned to support the members
- Leaders guide data collection & interpret data (they do not perform the reporting)
- Coordinate, facilitate, and support the efforts of members (do not supervise)

What do AmeriCorps Members serving in a VISTA project do?

Create Powerful Partnerships with businesses, community leaders, and other stakeholders

Expand current programs in demographic, geographic, and/or programmatic scope

Build volunteer management, leadership and training systems

Leverage both cash and in-kind resources by building development systems


VISTA Application Process

1 AmeriCorps VISTA Concept Paper

Organizations submit an AmeriCorps VISTA Concept Paper. The Concept Paper is a preliminary screening tool used to evaluate whether the organization would be an appropriate sponsor.

2 AmeriCorps VISTA Project Application

If AmeriCorps approves the Concept Paper, the organization submits an AmeriCorps VISTA Project Application based on the approved Concept Paper.

- Aligns with AmeriCorps focus areas/VISTA programming priorities
- Addresses the needs of a low-income community
- Involves the community in project development and implementation
- Leads to organizational capacity and sustainability
- Generates public or private sector resources
- Promotes local volunteer service
- Be specific

Concept Papers are submitted in eGrants.

Create an eGrants account:

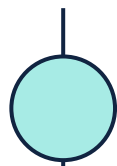
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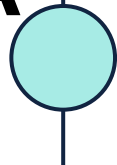
What makes an AmeriCorps VISTA Project- and application- successful?



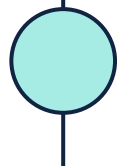
Clearly shows how the capacity building activities you are proposing directly ties into anti-poverty outcomes in the community you're serving



Includes deliberate engagement of your beneficiary population and communities



Is designed with the end in mind – when will your project become self-sustaining and how? With additional staff? Community volunteers? Partnerships with other organizations and agencies?



Focuses not only on the project activities but on the development of members. Members may be younger and in need of greater supervisor or they may be retired community members that can work on their own. As a project director and VISTA Project Supervisor, you will have to flex your skills to adapt to the people you recruit. It will be worth it in the end!
