## **SAMPLE--RSVP**

Performance Measure: 1.1 Systems Development

Community Need to be Addressed:

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 16% of grandparents over the age of 60 are responsible for their own grandchildren. This includes threegeneration households (where the children's parent(s) are present) and split-generation households where the children's parent(s) are not present). In Washington County, we estimate there are 250 grandparents over the age of 60 who are responsible for their grandchildren in a split-generation household.

Besides navigating their own healthcare and social service networks, grandparents raising grandchildren also have to navigate their grandchildren's healthcare and social service networks. These two networks may not intersect: for example, pediatric healthcare often happens in different offices and settings from adult or older adult healthcare. The grandchildren may qualify for public benefits that are unfamiliar to the grandparent. Navigating these systems can be overwhelming, especially if the grandparent doesn't know where to start. In addition, some organizations may not be aware of what other organizations are doing, which can cause the grandparent to get bounced from place to place as they try to find out where they can go for help.

Creating a "no wrong door" system in our county will help get grandparents raising grandparents connected to the resources they need. The system will be comprised of both older-adult serving organizations and youth-serving organizations, so that no matter where the grandparent turns for help, that organization can point them in the right direction. RSVP volunteers can use their knowledge of the local community to help develop the system and work with partner organizations to implement the system within their agency.
