Performance Measure: 1.1 Companionship

## Community Need to be Addressed:

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 16% of grandparents over the age of 60 are responsible for their own grandchildren. This includes threegeneration households (where the children's parent(s) are present) and split- generation households where the children's parent(s) are not present). In Washington County, we estimate there are 250 grandparents over the age of 60 who are responsible for their grandchildren in a splitgeneration household. Of these, 170 have transportation challenges that further isolate them from their community. These challenges include not having access to a vehicle or public transportation, not having a driver's license, living too far away from senior centers or other activities, and more.

While there are positive effects for grandparents and grandchildren living together, there are negative impacts, as well. Grandparents in splitgeneration households are older, less likely to be working, and more likely to have health or disability problems, which can lead to isolation and loneliness. These grandparents also have higher stress levels than other grandparents, which cause physical and emotional health issues. Transportation challenges compound these negative effects. Senior Companions can provide companionship to grandparents raising grandchildren at home to reduce isolation and loneliness and increase social supports.
