Other Use Cases of CEV Data

CEV data and/or measures are used in various other ways both within and beyond AmeriCorps. Examples of additional use cases include:

 - ServeVA's <u>Virginia Community Engagement Index</u> replicated CEV measures in an original survey about how Virginians dedicate their time to the organizations and activities that serve their communities
- Program evaluation
 - The YMCA has replicated CEV measures in its <u>Youth Civic Health Survey</u> since 2021 to help evaluate the impact of its <u>Youth and Government programs</u> on participant civic engagement
