



What is the community challenge?

Communities throughout California face a number of challenges, including unemployment, poverty, poor housing, educational needs, and language barriers. Many of the community organizations working to address these challenges are also dealing with shrinking budgets. Support from volunteers would be a greater help than ever, but often these same organizations lack the capacity to maximize this help.

What is CaSERVES-NCOE's promising solution?

The AmeriCorps Volunteer Infrastructure Program (VIP) was developed to build the volunteer capacity of non-profit and educational organizations serving California communities. Since 2009, AmeriCorps VIP has placed hundreds of members in community organizations with the specific targeted goal of systematically increasing their capacity to recruit, train, support, and utilize volunteers in order to more effectively serve their clients.

What did the evaluation of AmeriCorps VIP find?

As a grantee of AmeriCorps State and National through CaliforniaVolunteers, CaSERVES-NCOE engaged an independent evaluator to evaluate AmeriCorps VIP. The evaluation found that:



- AmeriCorps VIP had a **strong and much larger positive impact on organizational capacity concerning volunteers** than non-AmeriCorps VIP programs did,
- AmeriCorps VIP had a particularly strong, positive impact on:
 - **Clarity of volunteer roles**
 - **Volunteer recruitment and management**
 - **Including volunteers in decision-making**
- AmeriCorps VIP has a **high likelihood of producing similar results if replicated** with fidelity throughout California, and
- The differences in results between AmeriCorps VIP and similar programs were found to be **statistically significant**.

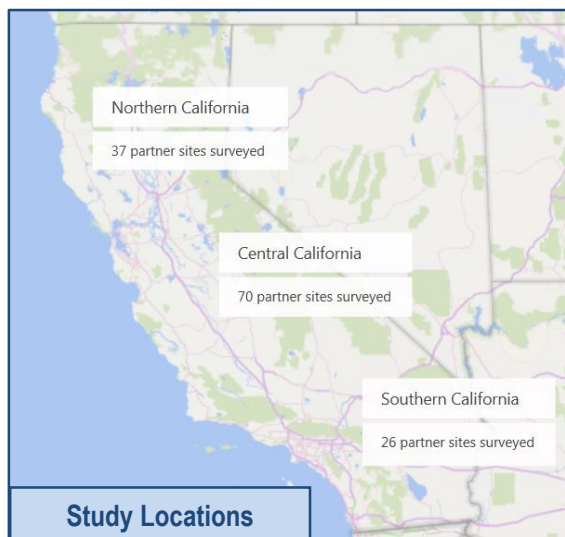

How is CaSERVES-NCOE using the evaluation findings to improve?

CaSERVES-NCOE has used the evaluation findings to improve services and expand its research agenda to address key areas of implementation.

- AmeriCorps VIP continues to focus on building volunteer capacity by refining and establishing clarity of volunteers’ roles, assessing their contributions, and including them in decision making.
- AmeriCorps VIP is focusing on developing protocols and other systems to build sustainability of volunteer capacity within those organizations.
- AmeriCorps VIP is assessing the types of organizations (both in size and scope of work) that benefit the most from the CaSERVES VIP program and the services that are most effective by organization type in order to increase impact even further moving forward.
- The organization has been able to use the evaluation results to communicate more effectively with stakeholders and build program support.
